General Instructions

These instructions are supplemented by important additional information available online.

Printed instructions and packing lists are not provided with the shipment

This is part of the green philosophy of TechnoFresh® (save a tree and all that)

In addition to this page, read the Super Shock page and Wash Schedules page for all the info you need to use TechnoFresh effectively.

TechnoFresh® works best when it dissolves before the detergent dissolves.

The preferred method is to put a capful of TechnoFresh® (about half an ounce/scoop) into the detergent dispenser drawer on top of the detergent so you disinfect the entire dispenser system too.

Some machines will not put enough water through the liquid dispenser tub to dissolve the TechnoFresh® completely.
If that happens,

Remove the small tub in the drawer used for liquid and try again.

Liquid first then TechnoFresh® on top.

If there still are issues put the TechnoFresh® directly into the drum before the laundry.

The amount you need depends on how you use your washer.

Experience is the only answer to determine the correct amount

TechnoFresh® will have maximum effect if you use one ounce in every load you run.

But every load usually is only necessary until the odor is controlled.

You should always try to use the smallest amount possible after you have the odor problem under control.

More than one capful/scoop in a load is a waste of material, unless you are trying to remove existing mildew smell from laundry or get control of a machine. Then two capfuls could be the correct amount... depending on how bad your problem is

Around ½ to ¾ oz per load as needed through the week usually works for ongoing wash schedules.

Everyone has a different use pattern

Always rinse your hands after handling TechnoFresh®.

Note:

I often work with people that have questions about how to use TechnoFresh® at first. I have found that, if there is a problem, some of the assumptions of how you are using the machine are off ...

50% of the time the customer is using too much detergent. The effect of TechnoFresh gets swamped. Use only enough detergent to cover the bottom of the detergent bottle cap. Ignore all the marks.

48% is because the super shock was not run or the buildup in the machine is so thick it takes a lot more shocks that expected to get the machine clean. I think these are the machines that pump out before starting so most of the vinegar is wasted. Use just enough vinegar to keep the machine sensor from starting the pump or better yet pause the machine just as it starts to spin up the dry laundry when it is detecting how much laundry is in the drum. Open the door and pour in the. The more you can get into the machine (2-3 gallons) for the shock the better it works.

The last 2% are the fun ones because things just don't make sense at first and solving the puzzle is fun. These are the one's where the customer needs to contact us directly

WARNING:

TechnoFresh™ can only be used for washing machines connected to a waste processing system (sewer or septic system) because they are designed to handle it. (Except for Aerobic Septic processing tanks that have a gray water discharge to reuse water for irrigation.)

It must not be discharged to any lake or waterway.
